Mitsubishi Motors Philippines Corporation (MMPC), Meralco, Department of Trade & Industry (DTI), and Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) recently held a Groundbreaking Ceremony at the DENR Headquarters in Visayas Avenue, Quezon City as a kick-off activity for the construction of four electric vehicle (EV) charging stations commissioned by MMPC for the two government

electric vehicle eco-system in the Philippines. Mitsubishi Motors Japan, through MMPC, donated five iMIEV and five Outlander Plug-in Hybrid Electric Vehicles (PHEV) to DENR and DTI. The company also provided the agencies four Chademo EV chargers.
