



TYPHOON SAFETY TIPS Things to remember during Typhoon

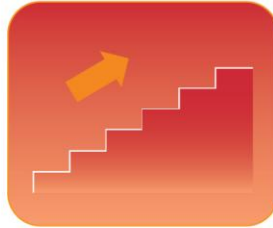


STAY TUNED

Monitor the storm's progress by listening in news advisories and storm warnings.

SNUG AS A BUG

Stay indoors where you are protected from the typhoon.



HIGH AND MIGHTY

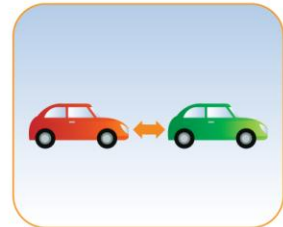
Move immediately to higher ground.

Water levels can rise where flash floods can occur.

TOO CLOSE FOR COMFORT

Keep a safe following distance between you and the vehicle in front of you.

The distance between you and the vehicle will give you enough time to react and stop when necessary if the car in front of you suddenly stops.



GLASS HOUSE

Stay clear from glass windows as they may shatter.

Strong winds can carry various debris that may hit your windows. Broken glass can cause severe injury.

LONG GONE

Stay away from coastal areas.

Strong winds and currents can cause sea levels to rise quickly and result in storm surges.



SHOW ME THE WAY

turn on your headlights and drive slower in the rain.

Turning on your headlights alerts other drivers and also helps with your visibility.

Do not drive a light vehicle through flood streets you can either lose control or risk stalling.
