



INDOOR SAFETY



GOT IT COVERED

Always keep outdoor electrical outlets and extension cords protected from getting wet



CLEAN AND CLEAR

Always have a clear access to your Electrical panels. (Just) in case of any emergency.



UNPLUGGED

Always unplug electrical appliances when not in use particularly heating devices as they might start a fire when left unattended.



AT ONE POINT OR ANOTHER

Avoid 'Octopus' Connections. Multiple connections on a single outlet



NEATLY TUCKED

Keep all wires and cords Organized, tucked and stored away



REPLACE ME / LET IT GO

Always cover exposed wires with appropriate insulation, accidental contact may cause damage or injury.



THE PERFECT MATCH

Always use the correct type of plug. Avoid forcing a plug into an outlet that does not fit.



HIDE AND SEEK

Avoid placing and running electrical cords under rugs or carpets. Constantly walking on them may damage the insulation.



IT PAYS TO KNOW

Always check for the appropriate voltage rating of any electrical appliance before plugging them into any outlet.



LET THE PROFESSIONALS HANDLE IT

Have your Electrical System routinely checked and maintained by a Licensed Electrician. **



THE PERFECT FIT

Always use the appropriate Size and rating of circuit breakers and fuses.



NEEDS FIXING

Replace any damaged or cracked convenience outlets.



BEFORE USE

Always check for Breaks, kinks, signs of wear and tear on electrical cords before use.



NICE AND DRY

Keep all electrical equipment and devices Far from sinks, showers and tubs.



CHILD PROOFING

Place electrical plug covers on outlets especially when there are children around.



PROPER HANDLING

Always pull from the plug and not the cord
